Juan Herreros is a Doctor of Architecture and Tenured Professor of Professional Practice at Columbia University, New York. He has developed his teaching and research activities at numerous institutions such as Princeton University, the Illinois Institute of Technology (IIT) in Chicago, and the Architectural Association in London.

His professional work has received numerous awards, including the International Fellowship from the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA); it has been extensively exhibited in museums such as the MoMA in New York, and published in monographs collected by Actar, TC Cuadernos, and AV. His theoretical legacy includes many articles and books, the latest of which is Textos Críticos published by Asimétricas. He has built projects in Spain, Panama, Colombia, Brazil, Argentina, Norway, France, Morocco, and South Korea, and currently has projects in the design or construction phase in Madrid, Bilbao, Santiago de Compostela, Bucharest, Buenos Aires, Santo Domingo, and the Mexican cities of Irapuato and Guadalajara.

His most significant recent project is the Munch Museum in Oslo, whose design and construction process was documented in the book Lambda Files published by Spector Books, and in the documentary More than a Museum (Netflix) by the Catalan director Morrosko Vila San Juan.
